The Fulbright Specialist Program

- Through the program, experienced U.S. academics and established professionals share expertise, gain international experience, and develop collaborative relationships through short-term (2-6 week) projects designed by overseas institutions.
- Activities conducted by Fulbright Specialists are conceptualized by host institutions and focus on education, training, and capacity building, rather than research.
- Established in 2001, the program is sponsored by the U.S. Department of State, Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs, and administered by World Learning.
